Everyday Histories

Have you ever wondered what your ancestors did and what their daily lives were like? This year's theme for Heritage Open Days is *Everyday Histories* and we invite you to discover how people used to live and work in the Sheffield area in times gone by.

Grade I listed Abbeydale Industrial Hamlet provides a vivid glimpse into the lives of Sheffield workers. Take a tour of this wonderfully preserved crucible steel works, dating from the 18th century, and imagine what life was like for the grinders, teemers, blacksmiths and forgers who produced the top-quality steel which made Sheffield famous across the world.

Step back in time to when Sheffield's old Head Post Office was a busy hub for Sheffield postal and telegraph system workers for nearly a hundred years, and see behind the scenes to explore where many Sheffielders worked, sorting parcels and working on the busy telephone exchange.

A guided walk around Castlegate will introduce you to the lives of the many people who have lived and worked in the area which was the birthplace of Sheffield, including history's most well-known asylum seeker, Mary Queen of Scots, and the notorious Victorian master criminal Charlie Peace.

More recently the stories of the volunteers who saved the former Victorian school buildings on Burton Street are an inspiring record of how the determination and vision of local people saved the buildings for the community. The building featured in the film *The Full Monty*, and now provides essential services to the local community through the Burton Street Foundation.

The Everyday Histories theme is optional but it's great to see so many venues around the city embracing it to tell the stories of Sheffield's people, both past and present. We hope you will enjoy discovering some of these stories and maybe they will inspire you to research and record your own *Everyday Histories* stories too!

Every year we have an exciting and diverse range of Heritage Open Days events taking place across the Sheffield area, and as always 2026 sees a great mix of new events and old favourites.

If you've ever walked past Sheffield's last police box on Surrey Street and wondered what's inside (is it really a TARDIS?) now is your chance to find out thanks to our friends at the National Emergency Services Museum. There'll be historic police vehicles on display and original artifacts to explore as you discover the stories of Sheffield's former 'Bobbies on the Beat.'

Visit Sheffield's popular inner-city playground Pounds Park and discover how this regeneration of an outdoor space has transformed this part of the city centre into a popular public leisure space. Meet the designers and discover how 'Play-Full' spaces in cities can successfully improve the city centre environment for everyone.

We are delighted that Meersbrook Hall will be opening its doors for us this year so you can discover the fascinating Everyday Histories of the many people who have lived and worked there over two and a half centuries. Can the building be saved and reopened to the public? Come and find out!

Heritage isn't just about old buildings, and our popular tours of the Streets in the Sky at Park Hill flats and of the Yellow Arch Studios have their unique stories to tell about our cultural heritage. Grade II* listed Park Hill has become an iconic feature of the city's landscape, and Yellow Arch, one of the UK's top live music and recording venues, continues to play a significant role in Sheffield's rich musical heritage.

Lots of our most intriguing and fascinating heritage lies outside of the city centre so take a trip out further afield and explore parts of the city you've maybe not visited before, there's lots to discover. Returning hidden gems include the fascinating History Museum in Stocksbridge, well worth a visit for its beautiful collection of locally made Bolsterstone glass, and to discover why this Steel Town is home to the modern umbrella.

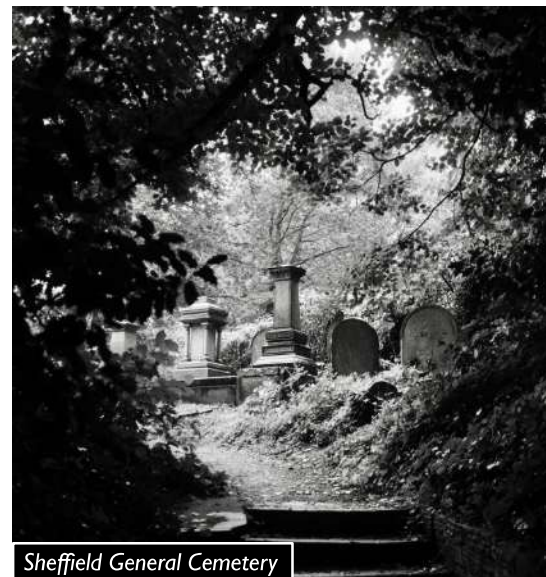

St George's Church, University of Sheffield

The University of Sheffield

We are delighted that the University of Sheffield is once again opening its doors for Heritage Open Days 2026. Founded in 1905, it is Sheffield's oldest university, now internationally famous for its academic excellence. The University also houses many rare collections and exhibitions in its historic and modern buildings.

This year you can take a tour of Grade II listed St George's Church, built in the early nineteenth century and acquired by the university in 1995. Discover the history of the church and its burial ground, the everyday histories associated with it, and learn about the peregrine falcons who nest and breed in St George's tower every year.

The peregrine falcons are also celebrated on a specially curated tour of the University's public art where you'll visit eight unique pieces of art around the campus which were inspired by the city's industrial and natural heritage.

The 'fantastical' Alfred Denny Museum is a Heritage Open Days favourite and has been used for undergraduate teaching for over one hundred years. Its exhibits and specimens date from the early twentieth century when collecting was at its peak.

The Turner Museum of Glass houses a fascinating collection of glass objects, including a fibre glass wedding dress, and wine glasses engraved with secret political statements. The collection is the life's work of Professor William Turner and is one of the UK's most fascinating and comprehensive collections of nineteenth and twentieth century glass.

Don't miss the chance to hear from Beccy Truman, curator of the Rope Women exhibition which is running over the summer at the Western Bank Library. Her talk for Heritage Open Days will look at the amazing history of aerial performance and the role of women in the circus.

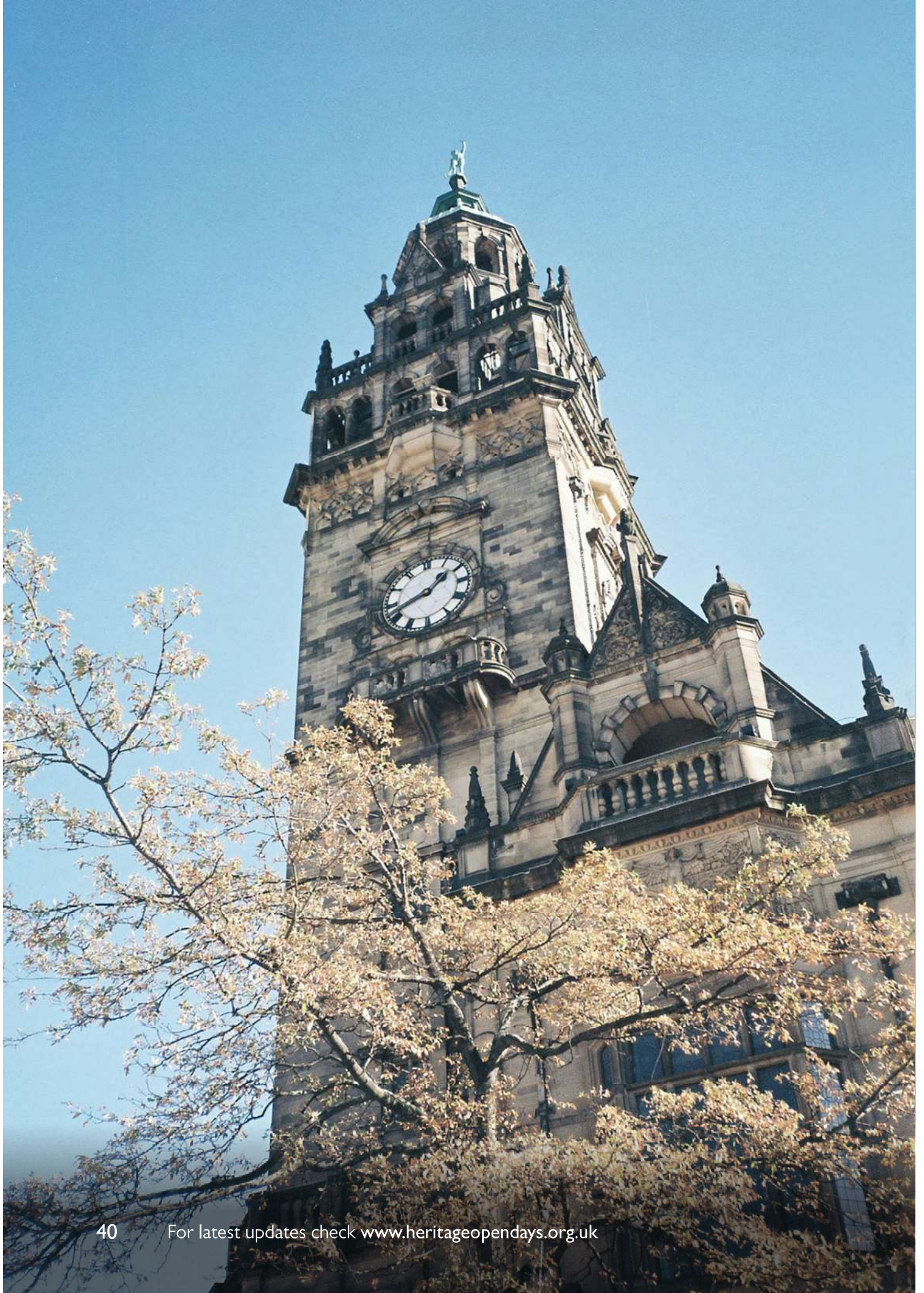
Wincobank Chapel and Iron Age Hillfort

Sheffield Town Hall

Sheffield Town Hall is one of just five Grade I listed buildings in Sheffield so we are delighted that this year we will be holding several Heritage Open Day events in this historic building, giving you the chance to go behind the scenes and discover the stories and secrets which lie within.

You can sign up for the ever-popular behind-the-scenes history tour where you'll be taken around the Town Hall's fine Victorian chambers to hear stories of the famous people who have visited, such as Queen Victoria, Queen Elizabeth II and Sir Winston Churchill. You'll see the magnificent architecture and many original features – and you can have your photo taken sitting on the Lord Mayor's 'throne'!

An illustrated talk on the Sheffield Blitz will take you back in time to learn how Sheffield people lived, worked and played in wartime Sheffield. The Town Hall was one of the few buildings to survive the bombing and you'll hear the fascinating story of how the city centre of today has been shaped by the events of those fateful December nights over eighty-five years ago.

We are delighted to be hosting a talk by Professor Judy Simons, author of *From Shtetl to Steel City*, which uses rare archive material, artefacts and documents to tell the hidden story of how impoverished Jewish immigrants fled from oppression to embrace a new life in Sheffield. Two hundred years of history has been discovered in archive material which tells of a community whose tenacity and determination made a significant impact on Sheffield's politics, commerce, industry and public life. Not to be missed!

The Town Hall will be throwing open its doors for a special Heritage Open Days family-friendly Open Day on 19th September offering visitors of all ages the chance to learn about the Town Hall refurbishment project, which aims to secure the long-term future of this historic building. There'll be lots of fun activities for children and families, a chance to delve into family history records from the past, and to explore the hidden corners and secrets of this important heritage building.

Sheffield Town Hall has been at the centre of the city's civic decision-making for over 125 years so come and take a rare look behind the scenes at one of our special Heritage Open Day events, full details in the brochure and online.
