Across Sheffield and South Yorkshire visitors will be able to learn about our rich industrial heritage, see the work of leading edge designers and craftspeople, and hear about the inventions and innovations we just can't live without. Alongside stories that astound and amaze there will also be opportunities to learn about the sheer hard work, ingenuity and occasional false starts that have led to cutting-edge inventions that have changed all our lives.

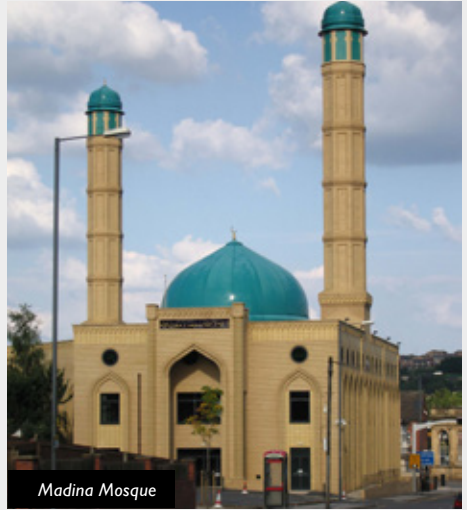

Spotlight on the Sheffield Hospitals History Collection

ONE OF THE most intriguing places to visit during Heritage Open Days is the Sheffield Hospital's History Collection, housed at Sheffield's Northern General Hospital. The collection is curated by the Sheffield Hospitals' History group which consists of retired Sheffield hospital staff who preserve the history of all Sheffield's former and present-day hospitals by collecting and preserving artefacts, memories, stories, photographs and items of memorabilia to save them for future generations.

Visitors to the Heritage Centre, which will open for tours during Heritage Open Days, can see old hospital instruments and equipment as well as portraits, busts and photographs all relating to the history of Sheffield Hospitals.

Sheffield's hospitals have a long and varied history. They include the Northern General and Nether Edge Hospitals which started

as workhouses in the mid to late 1800s, the Royal Hospital as a public dispensary in 1832, and the Royal Infirmary which opened in 1797.

Sheffield Medical Breakthroughs:

- Stuart Goodwin, a local industrialist, was the second person in Britain to be injected with insulin at Sheffield Royal Infirmary in 1923
- The first artificial cardiac valve (mitral) replacement in the world was performed at the Northern General Hospital in 1955 by Judson Chesterman
- Cecil Paine documented the first successful use of penicillin for babies with eye infections in Sheffield in 1930

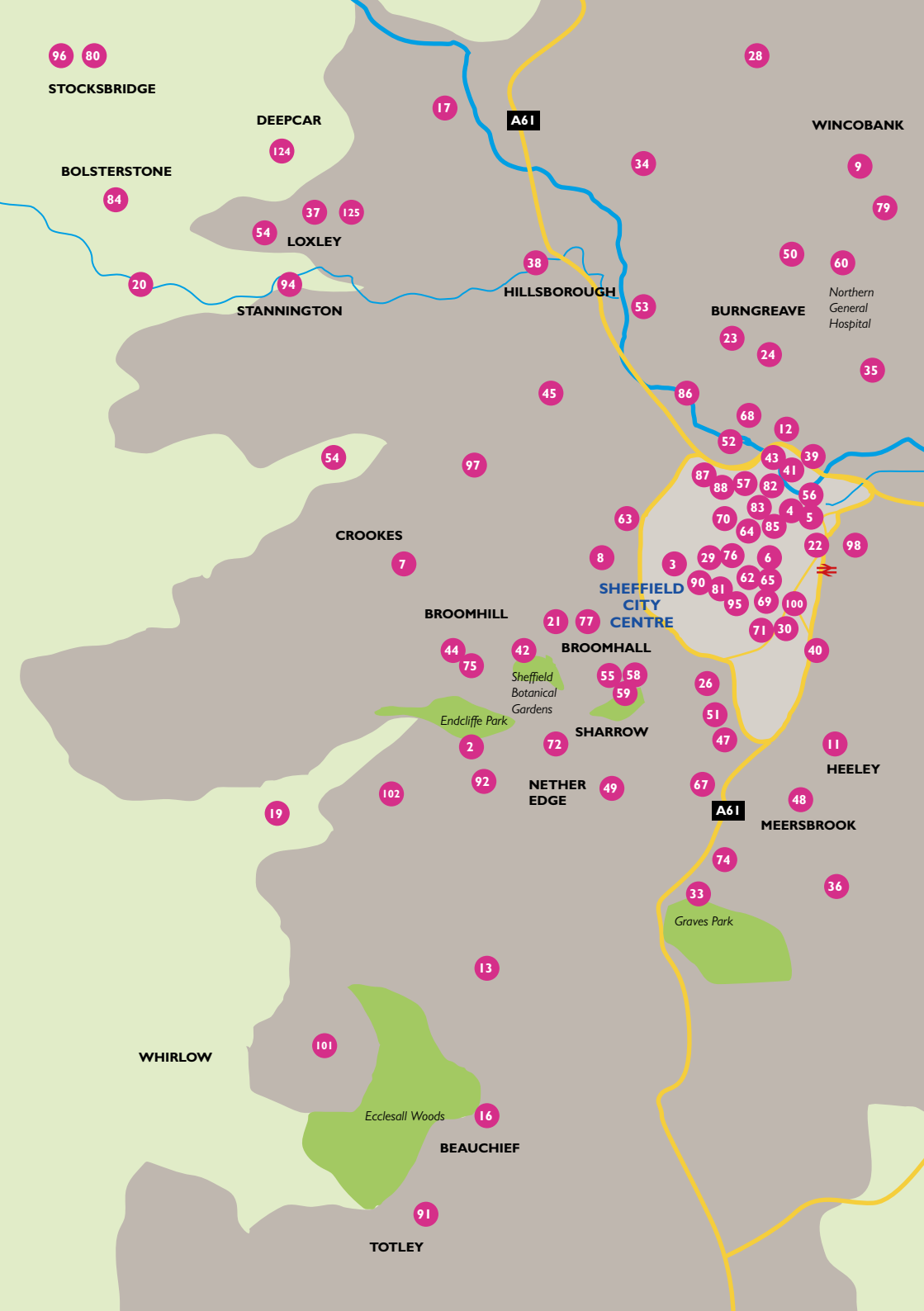

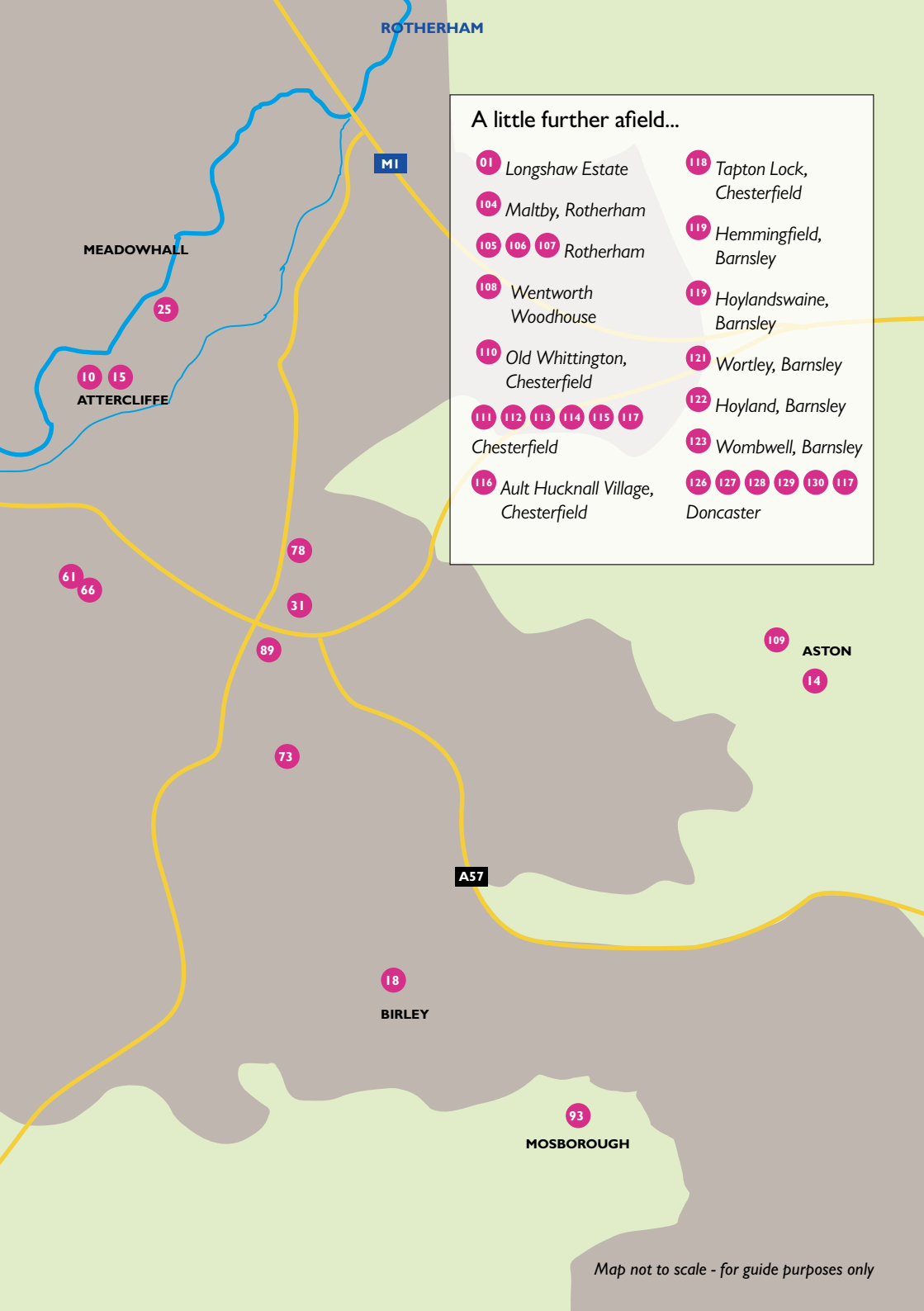
