Many of this year's events have a creative theme – you can learn about Sheffield's theatrical history on a walking tour around the former sites of the city's theatres, discover the creative roots of artists and makers through Butcher Works' online exhibition, and explore the landscapes of Robert Marnock in Sheffield's Victorian Botanical Gardens.

You can walk in the footsteps of Nether Edge's creative women on a tour of that historic part of the city, and embrace the creativity of artisans who built our heritage at St John's Church in Ranmoor (and even have a go at some crafts yourself.)

The Sheffield Visual Arts group will introduce you to public artworks around the city centre and you can discover the stories of the many creative individuals buried at Wardsend Cemetery. Why not get creative at Zion graveyard and have a go at sketching or photography with their resident artist Mia Parry?

This is just a taste of the many fantastic 'Creativity Unwrapped' events which will introduce you to Sheffield's creative and artistic heritage, and encourage you to unwrap your own creative talents too – and as always everything is completely FREE to access!

HAPPY BIRTHDAY SHEFFIELD WINTER GARDEN!

Sheffield's iconic Winter Garden celebrates its 20th anniversary this year. It is the largest urban glasshouse in Europe and was opened by Queen Elizabeth II on 22 May 2003.

Most of us will have been inside the Winter Garden at some point, to enjoy a break from the hustle and bustle of the city centre, to enjoy the variety of plants from across the world, or perhaps to soak up the atmosphere of the World Snooker Championships when the BBC broadcasts from there every spring.

Sheffield Winter Garden was designed by Pringle Richard Sharratt Architects, who also designed the adjoining Millenium Gallery as part of the first phase of Sheffield City Council's 'Heart of the City' project. In the last twenty years the Winter Garden has become an iconic structure in Sheffield City Centre, with its great glass roof ribbed with 21 huge wooden arches that sweep from floor to ceiling. It stands 70m long and 22m high and inside you can find huge pine and eucalyptus trees as well as many plants from across the world.

Its garden areas contain over 2,500 exotic and unusual trees and plants, and its seating areas and tranquil atmosphere give the Winter Garden the feeling of being an oasis in the city centre; an indoor park which complements the nearby outdoor Peace Gardens. Sheffield Winter Garden has become an important and much-loved amenity for the people of Sheffield over the last twenty years.

Sheffield Civic Trust, in association with the Sheffield Society of Architects, is proud to welcome Malcolm McGregor RIBA SCA from the original architect's team back to Sheffield to present a special talk and tour for Heritage Open Days in honour of its 20th birthday. This special one-off event will take you on the journey of Sheffield Winter Garden from idea to fruition and is bound to be one of the highlights of this year's festival.



SHEFFIELD: THE HOME OF FOOTBALL

id you know that without Sheffield the modern game of football wouldn't exist?

It was back in 1857 that Nathaniel Creswick and Willian Prest founded Sheffield FC, the world's first football club, and shortly afterwards drafted the club's rules of play which became the foundation of the modern game as we know it. And in 1860 Hallam FC opened the world's first football ground which led to the world's first inter-city club game being played on Boxing Day that year. Sheffield FC is recognised by FIFA as the world's oldest football club, and Pele said in 2007, 'Without Sheffield FC there wouldn't be a me.'

Sheffield United FC was established in 1889 at Bramall Lane, which holds the title of the Oldest Professional Football Ground in the World, and was the first ground to ever play a floodlit match. Sheffield Wednesday FC was formed in 1867 as an offshoot of the Wednesday Cricket Club and was known as The Wednesday Football Club until 1929. It is the second-oldest professional association football club in England and has played at Hillsborough since 1899.

Sheffield is also the home of the two oldest cup competitions which were held in 1867 and 1868, four years before the FA Cup, which is the oldest national football competition in the world.

Sheffield Civic Trust supports the 'Sheffield Home of Football' campaigners whose aim is to establish an international visitor attraction in Sheffield where fans from all over the world can come to visit the place where football was born. There are two Heritage Open Days 'Sheffield Home of Football' events taking place this year, a walking tour and a talk, where you can find out more about Sheffield's role in the beautiful game. There's also a special 'Sheffield Home of Football' beer being brewed by Little Mesters Brewery which you can enjoy throughout the festival on tap at the Gardeners Rest in Neepsend.




